

RESTAURANT REVITALIZATION FUND (RRF) – OVERVIEW FOR NH FOOD SERVICE PROVIDERS TUES APR 27, 10-11 am via Zoom

The American Rescue Plan contains a \$28.6 billion Restaurant Relief Fund to aid one of the hardest-hit sectors during the economic downturn caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) will administer the funds to the hardest-hit small restaurants. For details on the fund and the application, <u>click here</u>.

This program will provide restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss up to \$10 million per business and no more than \$5 million per physical location. Recipients are not required to repay the funding as long as funds are used for eligible uses no later than March 11, 2023.

Shuttered Venue Operators Grant (SVOG) applications experienced some technical difficulties during startup last Thursday. Potential applicants should register in the federal government's System for Award Management (SAM.gov), as this is required for an entity to receive an SVOG, and reference the preliminary application checklist and eligibility requirements.

MIDDLE ROAD TRAFFIC-CALMING PROJECT


