

VOLUNTARY WATER RESTRICTIONS **REMAIN IN PLACE** -- The Seacoast remains in Stage 1 of a drought, with abnormally dry conditions. Recent rainfall has only slightly reduced water supply demands that increased with last month's hot and dry weather. Therefore, the City of Portsmouth and Pease International Tradeport water systems continue to ask customers to voluntarily conserve water. If dry conditions return, mandatory restrictions on non-essential water use may be required. They could include odd/even watering schedules. 

PEIRCE ISLAND WASTERWATER TREATMENT FACILITY DEDICATION TUES

JUL 13 at 5 pm. Facility tours, in small groups, follow dedication remarks. NH Department of Environment Services Commissioner Robert Scott will tour the facility with DPW Director Peter Rice. The \$92 million project marks a milestone in the City's history and with \$75 million in state funding, is the largest in the history of the NH State Revolving Fund loan programs that support drinking water safety, water quality, and public health through low-cost financial assistance. City officials and representatives from EPA and the project design and construction firms will participate. The event is open to the public. Please park in the gravel lot at the end of Peirce Island Road.

PRESCOTT PARK GARDEN TOURS START

FRI JUL 9 at 11 am and 1 pm -- The 10-acre Prescott Park, deeded to the City for the perpetual use and enjoyment of residents and visitors, contains a variety of individual garden spaces, from the formal plantings around the sculptural elements of the massive waterfront anchor and Cabot Lyford's "Whale," to the bed of hostas along the shaded Mechanic Street edge of the garden. In between are the Liberty Gardens beds of annuals designed and installed by City staff, including summer associates who are leading the tours. The free Prescott Park Garden Tours are conducted every Friday at 11 am and 1 pm, starting at the Liberty Pole. Staff welcome visitors' questions about their designs and the plants they chose for this year's gardens.


BANFIELD ROAD CONSTRUCTION – Single lane traffic for pipe installation under the road.

VOTER RE-REGISTRATION FOR THOSE WHO HAVE NOT VOTED SINCE 2017 -- Per

New Hampshire State law, all municipalities in the state must certify their lists of registered voters every ten years. The last time this was done in Portsmouth was 2010. The Portsmouth City Clerk has announced that any resident who was registered as a voter in the City of Portsmouth but who has not voted in the past four years (since April 1, 2017) must re-register before August 1, 2021 to remain on the voter rolls. The City Clerk's office can process voter reregistrations and new registrations during regular office hours at City Hall (Mon 8 am - 6 pm. Tues, Wed, Thurs 8 am - 4:30 pm. Fri 8 am - 1 pm). In addition, the Portsmouth Board of Registrars is hosting two special sessions at City Hall for these registrations:

- Tues, July 13, 4:30-6 pm
- Tues, July 20, 9-10:30 am

Applicants for registration who possess proof of identity, age, citizenship and domicile (Portsmouth home address) should bring that proof when they come to register. Qualified applicants who do not possess proof or who do not bring proof with them may still register if they sign an affidavit attesting to their qualifications for identity, age, and citizenship and domicile. Eligible residents of Portsmouth are always able to register to vote on election day.
