### **CITY MEETING BROADCASTS IN HD**

**STARTING JUL 19** – The City has broadcast in high definition over YouTube for several years and soon those with Comcast HD will be able to watch City's government access broadcasts in HD on the new Channel 1072. Channel 22 remains in service for those who do not have HD.

### VOTER RE-REGISTRATION FOR THOSE WHO HAVE NOT VOTED SINCE 2017 -- Any

resident who was registered as a voter in the City of Portsmouth but who has not voted in the past four years (since April 1, 2017) must re-register before August 1, 2021 to remain on the voter rolls.

The City Clerk's office can process voter reregistrations and new registrations during regular office hours at City Hall (Mon 8 am - 6 pm. Tues, Wed, Thurs 8 am -4:30 pm. Fri 8 am -1 pm). In addition, the Portsmouth Board of Registrars is hosting two special sessions at City Hall for these registrations:

- Tues, July 13, 4:30-6 pm
- Tues, July 20, 9-10:30 am

Applicants for registration who possess proof of identity, age, citizenship and domicile (Portsmouth home address) should bring that proof when they come to register. Qualified applicants who do not possess proof or who do not bring proof with them may still register if they sign an affidavit attesting to their qualifications for identity, age, and citizenship and domicile. **Eligible residents of Portsmouth are always able to register to vote on election day.**

# FRI JUL 16! NEW CONFIGURATION FOR CATE & BARTLETT STREETS STARTS –

The new connector road from Bartlett Street to the Route 1 Bypass opens on Friday, July 16. The new through-street, named "Hodgdon Way," branches off Cate Street and continues to the Route 1 By-Pass. The new through-street includes a re-alignment of the intersection of Bartlett and Cate Streets. The new configuration will incorporate the following changes:

- Entering the intersection from upper Bartlett Street, traffic will come to a complete stop at the new stop sign at the reconfigured Bartlett-Cate Street intersection (before continuing under the railroad trestle);
- Traffic coming from Islington Street will now be able to flow unimpeded to Cate Street or up Bartlett without having to stop;
- Traffic coming from the Bypass will travel unimpeded until the traffic signal at Islington Street.

The new direct route between the Bypass and the West End of Portsmouth allows for through-traffic to avoid the Bartlett Street residential neighborhood and will expedite ambulance service to Portsmouth Regional Hospital. Truck traffic will also now be excluded from Bartlett Street, as recommended by the Parking & Traffic Safety Committee and adopted by the City Council on June 21, 2021. This revised intersection configuration will be monitored and adjusted as needed over the next few weeks.

**PEASE PAVING TUES JUL 13:** continue paving New Hampshire Ave to Newington Dr. at Pease Blvd. WED JUL 14: paving International Dr. from Oak to Rye.

**DENNETT STREET** – Construction underway, removing manhole covers on the section from Hunters Hill to Maplewood, in preparation for removing and replacing the gravel underlay then grading the road for binding and the overlay. Project is expected to take three weeks. Parking limitations in place where posted.



MAPLEWOOD AVE COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT – NO PARKING on Central Avenue and Ashland Street on TUES July 13. Once paved, please use caution while making turns on the fresh asphalt. No sharp turns and keep your vehicle in motion while turning. Application of a surface treatment on Woodbury Avenue Thurs July 15 (depending on weather) will prohibit travel on the treated surface for approximately 2 hours. One-way alternating traffic in place and access to driveways will be limited. A detour will be in place when Maplewood Avenue is not accessible from Woodbury Avenue. Also, Maple Street at the intersection of Maplewood will be reconstructed.

### THURS JUL 15: NH MOBILE VACCINE VAN --

NH DHHS, in partnership with ConvenientMD, Has launched the NH Mobile Vaccine Van, a new initiative to increase access to COVID-19 vaccines across the state. The first stop is PORTSMOUTH – at the Roundabout Diner on THURS Jul 15 from 8 am to 3 pm. All three FDA authorized vaccines will be available (Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson). Translation services will also be available.

### I LOST MY PROOF-OF-VACCINATION CARD.

**NOW WHAT?** All vaccination records are kept on file in the CDC National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) system. NH DHHS advises that you can replace a lost vaccination card in either of two ways:

- Download and complete the vaccination card replacement request form here: <u>https://tinyurl.com/4pj4chcz</u> Note that the completed form MUST BE NOTARIZED before sending it back to NH DHHS.
- 2. If your healthcare provider has access to the NHIIS, ask him/her to print out the record directly from NHIIS.
