CITY CLERK ANNOUNCES MUNICIPAL ELECTION FILING SEASON: MON AUG 30 -

MON SEP 13 -- The following Non-Partisan Offices will filled by the municipal election on November 2, 2021:


- City Council (9 positions)
- School Board (5 positions)
- Fire Commission (2 positions)
- Police Commission (2 positions)

Anyone filing as a candidate in the Municipal Election must be a qualified voter in the City of Portsmouth, shall have been a resident of the City for at least two years immediately preceding the Election, and may not hold any other Municipal Office once elected. Declarations of Candidacy will be accepted in the Office of the City Clerk during regular business hours. All filings must be done in person. REMINDER: NEW CONFIGURATION FOR CATE & BARTLETT STREETS STARTS –

The new connector road from Bartlett Street to the Route 1 Bypass opened on Friday, July 16. The new through-street, named "Hodgdon Way," branches off Cate Street and continues to the Route 1 By-Pass. The new through-street includes a re-alignment of the intersection of Bartlett and Cate Streets. For a larger version of the map above, click here: <u>https://tinyurl.com/yr8wxx3k</u>

The new direct route between the Bypass and the West End of Portsmouth allows for through-traffic to avoid the Bartlett Street residential neighborhood and expedites ambulance service to Portsmouth Regional Hospital. Truck traffic is now be excluded from Bartlett Street. This revised intersection configuration will be monitored and adjusted as needed over the next few weeks.


DENNETT STREET – Construction underway. Project is expected to take three weeks. Parking limitations in place where posted.



MAPLEWOOD AVE COMPLETE STREETS

PROJECT – Final paving of Maple Street at the intersection of Woodbury Avenue (weather dependent). Driveway paving will begin on Cutts Street, Central Avenue, Beechwood Street and Ashland Street.

BANFIELD ROAD CONSTRUCTION – Next week: construction to install sidewalks between Heritage and Ocean Road. Single-lane traffic continues for pipe installation under the road.

NOW IN PLACE 24/7 – Brief water services interruptions will be required to connect buildings between Dover Street and Cass Street to the new water main. Interruptions are expected to last around 15 minutes and residents will be notified prior to the water service interruption. There is potential for scheduled water shutdowns on Dover Street and State Street to complete connections required to sequence water main installations. I LOST MY PROOF-OF-VACCINATION CARD.

NOW WHAT? All vaccination records are kept on file in the CDC National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) system. NH DHHS advises that you can replace a lost vaccination card in either of two ways:

- Download and complete the vaccination card replacement request form here: <u>https://tinyurl.com/4pj4chcz</u> Note that the completed form MUST BE NOTARIZED before sending it back to NH DHHS.
- 2. If your healthcare provider has access to the NHIIS, ask him/her to print out the record directly from NHIIS.
