WEEKLY MOBILE VACCINATION VAN Every Wednesday Aug 4-Sep 15, 8 am to 1 pm in Market Square -- NH DHHS provides FREE vaccinations (all three vaccines) to anyone wishing one. Translation services also available.

CDC GUIDANCE FOR VACCINATED PEOPLE UPDATED – On July 27, the CDC updated its guidance for those who have been vaccinated: residents in areas with “High” or “Severe” Community Transmission rates should consider wearing masks indoors, whether they are vaccinated or not, due to the higher infectiousness of the Delta variant. HAVEN WELL RESTORED TO SERVICE THIS WEEK -- After seven years of research, treatment piloting and engineering design, followed by the installation at the upgraded Pease Water Treatment Facility of a sophisticated, multi-step treatment system which includes cartridge, resin filtration and GAC filtration, the NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) has issued a permit for the City to restore operation of the well. The well is expected to go back into service this week and the water will be tested weekly. The City of Portsmouth took the Haven Well off-line in 2014 after testing revealed the presence of perfluorooctanesulfonic acid (PFOS) chemicals in the water at levels that measured higher than the Environmental Protection Agency’s preliminary health advisory level. 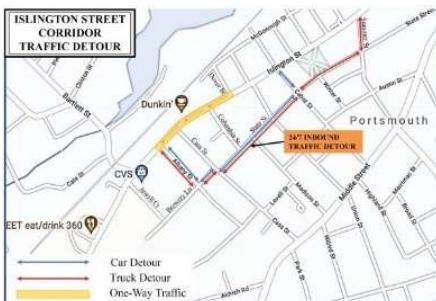

CHEVROLET AVENUE SIDEWALK PROJECT STARTED JUL 30 – Murtha Landscape prep work at 200 Cass St. and 16 Chevrolet Ave., removing the plants that will be relocated for the final landscape design. Advanced Excavation is the general contractor for the construction of a new sidewalk.

BANFIELD ROAD -- Removing stumps to begin installing the sidewalk between Heritage and Ocean Road. Single-lane traffic continues for pipe installation under the road with work impacting the Banfield-Peverly Hill Road intersection.

ALDRICH ROAD TRAFFIC CALMING – Speed tables and curbing being installed on Wed or Thurs this week.

CLOUGH DRIVE & LITTLE HARBOUR SCHOOL DRIVEWAY – Road work and paving continues.



ISLINGTON STREET -- Returned to two-way traffic on weekends and overnight, but single-lane during the day for installation of curbing and sidewalks. For the weekly update and to subscribe to the weekly eblast, click here:

DENNETT STREET – Gas main replacement work continues to Labor Day. DPW will be able to complete their project immediately after that, but will probably not be finished until the end of October.



MAPLEWOOD AVE COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT – Final paving of Maple Street at the intersection of Woodbury Avenue (weather dependent). Driveway paving of Cutts Street and Central Avenue.

LITTLE BAY WATER LINE PROJECT – The City is advancing a project to install an additional water line adjacent to two existing pipes carrying water from the Madbury Reservoir across Little Bay to the city. As part of the standard permitting process, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, New England District (USACE) has published a Public Notice inviting public comment regarding the City's permit for the water line work. (Click here: <https://tinyurl.com/rnmjbpc> for File Number: NAE-2019-01078.) The deadline for comments is August 19, 2021. The project is expected to go out for bid in Fall 2021, with construction during Winter 2021-22.

RETURN TO EMPLOYMENT SUMMER STIPEND PROGRAM -- Applications for the program are now open for the first people who returned to work. Visit <https://tinyurl.com/4abbah9v> to see if you're eligible. NH suspended Dept of Employment Security COVID-19 unemployment supplements on May 18 and announced a “summer stipend” of \$500 for part-time and \$1000 full-time jobs that those in the NHES system receiving unemployment benefits secured and worked for 8 weeks. (Those who receive \$25/hour or less.) Employees can now apply for the benefit with proof of 8 weeks new employment since May 18. Those who were already registered in the NHES system should check their individual dashboards for eligibility and instructions on filing for the stipend.

EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES ASSISTANCE

<https://www.capnh.org/covid19> The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) has also launched a new tool (<https://tinyurl.com/4hawaxf4>) that allows renters and landlords to find rental assistance programs in their area. Applications for \$26 million in support available to NH residents are handled through NH Community Action Partnership (CAP). Landlords and tenants are encouraged to apply to avoid any impacts from the end to the eviction moratorium. Once you have an application in progress, you are protected.

REMINDER: NEW CONFIGURATION FOR CATE & BARTLETT STREETS STARTS –

The new through-street, named “Hodgdon Way,” branches off Cate Street and continues to the Route 1 By-Pass. The design includes a re-alignment of the

I LOST MY PROOF-OF-VACCINATION CARD. NOW WHAT? All vaccination records are kept on file in the CDC National Health Interview Survey

(NHIS) system. NH DHHS advises that you can replace a lost vaccination card in either of two ways:

1. Download and complete the vaccination card replacement request form here: <https://tinyurl.com/4pj4chcz> Note that the completed form MUST BE NOTARIZED before sending it back to NH DHHS.
2. If your healthcare provider has access to the NHIIS, ask him/her to print out the record directly from NHIIS.
