95 MECHANIC STREET SEAWALL RECONSTRUCTION STARTED MON AUG 23 –

ACK Marine, under contract to the City's Department of Public Works, began work on the project to rebuild the seawall at 95 Mechanic Street. The project requires driving pilings for construction purposes, and the Department of Public Works has secured all necessary NH Department of Environmental Services permits and contracted with Hartford Structural Inspections to complete documentation of adjacent structures to monitor any unanticipated effects that result from the construction. LITTLE HARBOUR SCHOOL DRIVEWAY/CLOUGH DRIVE PAVING COMPLETE – In time for the opening of school

BANFIELD ROAD -- Culvert replacement, sidewalk and traffic calming: Preparing for new sidewalk between Heritage and Ocean Road. In addition, two speed tables and two three-way stops -- at both the Heritage Ave. and Constitution Ave. intersections -- will be constructed during the final paving process. Paving: The section of Banfield from Peverly Hill Road to Constitution Ave. is being reclaimed, reinforced and graded so that it can receive its first layer of new pavement in the next week and a half. A single-lane traffic pattern is in effect for both areas, with flaggers in the construction areas, on weekdays between 7 am and 5 pm.

ALDRICH ROAD TRAFFIC CALMING – Speed tables, curbing work and signage installation. Paving this week. Should be finalized by Aug 25.

DENNETT STREET – Gas main replacement work continues to Labor Day. DPW will be able to complete their project immediately after that, finishing by the end of October.

I LOST MY PROOF-OF-VACCINATION CARD. NOW WHAT? All vaccination records are kept on

file in the CDC National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) system. NH DHHS advises that you can replace a lost vaccination card in either of two ways:

- Download and complete the vaccination card replacement request form here: https://tinyurl.com/4pj4chcz Note that the completed form MUST BE NOTARIZED before sending it back to NH DHHS.
- 2. If your healthcare provider has access to the NHIIS, ask him/her to print out the record directly from NHIIS.
