

95 MECHANIC STREET SEAWALL
RECONSTRUCTION – ACK Marine, under
contract to the City's Department of Public Works, has
started work to rebuild the seawall at 95 Mechanic
Street. Equipment and materials are being delivered
on Monday and Wednesday. Cofferdam sheeting is
being installed with vibratory hammers, all day

BANFIELD ROAD -- Culvert replacement, sidewalk and traffic calming: Preparing for new sidewalk between Heritage and Ocean Road. In addition, two speed tables and two three-way stops -- at both the Heritage Ave. and Constitution Ave. intersections -- will be constructed during the final paving process. Paving: The section of Banfield from Peverly Hill Road to Constitution Ave. is being reclaimed, reinforced and graded for paving in the next week. A single-lane traffic pattern is in effect for both areas, with flaggers in the construction areas, on weekdays between 7 am and 5 pm.

DENNETT STREET – Gas main replacement work continues to Labor Day. DPW will be able to complete their project immediately after that, finishing by the end of October.

ISLINGTON STREET -- West of Bartlett Street: Final striping and paving of driveway tie-ins. Albany Street to Dover Street: Fine grade and install concrete sidewalks and tree wells. **Asphalt binder paving on Wed. Sep 1**. Columbia Street Area: Continue water main installation, with possible water testing.

MAPLEWOOD AVE --. Miscellaneous work on punchlist items will continue on an intermittent basis until the project has reached final completion at the end of September.



The intent of the meeting is to collect input from the public, municipal officials, regulatory and resource agencies, and abutting property owners on their ideas and concerns relative to the alternatives considered and the proposed action selected. A review of the existing site conditions, design considerations, construction materials, and schedule will be followed by a question, answer, and comment period.

UPDATED: POST-VACCINATION FAQS

My vaccination is not recorded properly in the NH DHHS database. I have a vaccination card,

but some travel destinations require the full record. What should I do? Contact NHIIS (NH Immunization Information System) at 603-271-4028, by email at nhiis.support@dhhs.nh.gov or click here for the NH DHHS website

for the immunization information system (NHIIS). On this site, you will be guided in selecting the correction forms for your PCP to verify your vaccine card, DOB, etc. You will need to get the form notarized and before sending it back to NHIIS. Once your record is corrected and you can request an official vaccine and immunization record. This record is the one that would be accepted when travelling if the vaccine card is not enough. I LOST MY PROOF-OF-VACCINATION CARD. NOW WHAT? All vaccination records are kept on file in the CDC National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) system. NH DHHS advises that you can replace a lost vaccination card in either of two ways:

- Download and complete the vaccination card replacement request form here: https://tinyurl.com/4pj4chcz Note that the completed form MUST BE NOTARIZED before sending it back to NH DHHS.
- 2. If your healthcare provider has access to the NHIIS, ask him/her to print out the record directly from NHIIS.
