

MEMORIAL DAY OBSERVANCES -- On Fri May 27 at 10:30 am, the traditional Burial at Sea service takes place in Prescott Park at 10 am. On Mon May 30, the Memorial Day parade returns, starting from Junkins Ave/Parrott Ave at 1 pm and proceeding to South Cemetery for a commemoration program at 2 pm. A public cookout follows at Prescott Park. City Hall is closed from Fri May 27 at 1 pm through Mon May 30, reopening at 8 am on Tues May 31. The Portsmouth Public Library is closed on Sat May 28, Sun May 29, Mon May 30. Recreational Facilities are closed on Mon May 30 (open on Sat & Sun). Trash pickup normally scheduled for Mon will be picked up on Tues (Recycling Center is open on Sat May 28).

CHANGES IN VOTERS' PARTY AFFILIATION MUST BE MADE BY MAY 31 -- Kelli Barnaby, City Clerk for the City of Portsmouth has announced that the deadline for anyone wishing to make any change to their party affiliation is Tuesday, May 31, 2022 in order for the change to apply to their voting in the 2022 State Primary Election on September 13, 2022. The City Clerk's Office is open on May 31 until 6 pm and the Board of Registrars will also be available in City Hall from 5:30 to 7:30 pm that day to make **changes.** Voters may change party affiliation with the City Clerk except between the first day of the filing period for the primary election and the date of the primary election itself. Therefore, during this year's Primary Election cycle, party affiliation changes will not be accepted between June 1 and September 13, 2022.

CONSTRUCTION WORK THIS WEEK:

For information about each of the seasonal DPW projects now underway, click on the drop down Projects menu on the DPW page on the City website.

EVERSOURCE MARKET STREET PROJECT --

The project involves installing subsurface conduit to connect to transformers that are housed in the Hanover Street Garage to provide enhanced electrical power to that area of downtown. **The initial phases** are on Market Street and impacts the availability of parking to allow continuous one lane traffic around the work zones. Work hours are 7 am to 5 pm, Monday through **Friday**. Work will be complete before Memorial Day Weekend with roadway patching and temporary sidewalks for the summer. Final repairs to this area will occur in the fall. After Memorial Day, the work will shift to Ladd Street and will limit traffic on High and Ladd Streets between Congress and Market Street. Flaggers will be on-site throughout all phases of the work to aid vehicle and pedestrian travel and to assure access to all business. PENHALLOW STREET CLOSED TO THRU
TRAFFIC: THURS May 26 & FRI May 27
between Custom House Lane and Daniel
Street during work day. Eversource will be pulling
wires thru the conduit infrastructure during the day,
with Penhallow opening up at the end of each
day. Traffic on Penhallow will be handled as in the
past (Custom House Lane will exit their street heading

towards State St.). Masonry work, framing and exterior elements of the building continue as does work in the west alley and south alley, preparing for fountain foundations and hardscape. Sidewalk brick repair on Daniel Street continues. **DANIEL & PENHALLOW BUSINESSES ARE OPEN. Pedestrian access maintained.**

SAGAMORE AVE SEWER EXTENSION
PROJECT -- Impacting Sagamore Avenue, Shaw
Road, Cliff Road and Walker Bungalow Road.
Excavation work starts on Sagamore Ave., then
continues to the other streets. Travel is limited,
intermittently, to a single lane of alternating one-way
travel, Mon-Fri between 7 am and 6 pm. Flaggers,
signs, and portable traffic lights used to control traffic.
Vehicles and pedestrians traveling on Sagamore
Avenue should expect minor delays. Go to the

DODGE AVE/HARVARD ST./PRINCETON ST. (NEAR RTE 33 PARK 'N RIDE) – Reclamation and repaving project expected to take about two weeks.

MARCY STREET-NEW CASTLE AVE GAS LINE REPLACEMENT – Unitil gas company is now working to replace the gas main, all the gas services under the road and all of the main tie ins to the side streets (Pray, Partridge, Holmes, Walden and Humphreys). This work will take about three weeks. After that, Advanced Paving will return for the rebuilding and repaving project.

STATE STREET AREA – Miscellaneous clean up on the Bartlett and Islington Street Intersection, Albany Street to Dover Street, Columbia Street Area and State Street.

NEIGHBORHOOD PARKING PROGRAM PILOT EXTENDED THROUGH SEP 5 -- The Neighborhood Parking Program pilot remains in effect through Labor Day, September 5, 2022 to collect a full year of data on its impacts.


NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN ON FLEET STREET FOR OUTDOOR DINING: Traffic is now ONE-WAY, from Congress to Hanover. There is no access to the Hanover garage from Hanover Street. Effective through Nov 27. All Fleet Street businesses are open and sidewalks are open to pedestrians.

OUTDOOR DINING -- These 37 restaurants are approved for outdoor dining permits include: 110 Grill, 250 Market, Black Trumpet, BRGR BAR, Cafe Espresso, Cava, Durbar Square, Dwyer's Pub, Elephantine Bakery, Fezziwig's Food & Fountain,

Fresh House, Jumpin' Jay's Fish Café, Kaffee Vonsolln, La Caretta Portsmouth, Moxy, Popovers on the Square, Portsmouth Feed Company, Portsmouth Gas Light Co., Raleigh Wine Bar + Eatery, Ristorante Massimo, Rosa Restaurant, Row 34,The Sol, Stroll Café, The Clipper Tavern, The District, The Franklin, The Goat, The Goods Market & Café, The Green Room, The Hammer Pub & Grille, The Portsmouth Brewery, The Press Room, Thirsty Moose Taphouse, Tjs Food and Spirits, Toscana, Tuscan Market. Be sure to check first before visiting, as outdoor dining continues to be set up. Planters will be added mid-May.

CDC GUIDANCE ON ASSESSING COMMUNITY RISK – CDC recommends using its online tool -- COVID-19 Community

Levels based on hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. The City Manager encourages the use of masks indoors in City facilities. Please note that masks are still required in the Portsmouth Public Library.

CDC RECOMMENDS BOOSTER FOR CHILDREN 5-11 — Following FDA Emergency Use Authorization on May 17, the CDC on May 19 recommended a booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine for children ages 5 to 11. Children in this age group who received their last dose at least five months earlier are eligible to receive the additional doses immediately.

CDC GUIDANCE ON OPTIONAL SECOND BOOSTER -- On March 30, 2022 The CDC updated their <u>Interim Clinical Considerations</u> <u>for Use of COVID-19 Vaccines</u> to allow for a 2nd booster dose in certain persons:

- Persons 12 or older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster
- All persons 50 years of age or older may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster. The second booster is recommended for those age 60+
- Persons 18-49 years of age who received the J&J COVID-19 vaccine for both their primary series and 1st booster may receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their J&J booster.

FDA LIMITS USE OF J&J VACCINE -- Due to the ongoing risk of rare but serious blood clots. The problem occurs in the first two weeks after vaccination. Under the new FDA instructions, J& J's vaccine could still be given to people who had a severe allergic reaction to one of the other vaccines and can't receive an additional dose. J& J's shot could also be an option for people who refuse to receive the mRNA vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna, and therefore would otherwise remain unvaccinated.

EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES

ASSISTANCE – The NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

- Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period <u>not</u> to exceed 18 months.
- At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship <u>during</u> the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

- Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees
- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.
- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
