
SAGAMORE AVE SEWER EXTENSION

CDC GUIDANCE ON ASSESSING

CDC AUTHORTIZES VACCINES FOR CHILDREN UNDER 5 -- Following FDA review and Emergency Use Authorization, the CDC has released supplies of the new Moderna and Pfizer vaccines for children under 5. The NH DHHS is distributing the vaccines to authorized pediatricians' offices because:

- Pediatricians have the best patient history for these children and have trusted relationships with their families.
- 2. Pediatricians have extensive experience with vaccinating small children.
- 3. The administration of the COVID-19 vaccine provides the opportunity to administer other childhood vaccines.
- 4. The pediatricians' offices are an appropriate medical environment for vaccination -- and immediately addressing any issues that arise.
- 5. NHDHHS will be apportioning its first supplies of the under 5 vaccines -- and the detailed instructions differentiating all the vaccines -- to the pediatricians who have signed up for their distribution network.

NHDHHS said on their Jun 9 Health Care Provider call that the state would start delivering vaccines on Jun 20 to the pediatricians who had ordered by 8 Jun, and would deliver Jun 23-29 to the pediatricians who ordered after Jun 8. SOME of the commercial pharmacies that have been participating in the Federal vaccine distribution network will receive the under 5 vaccines. But not all (CVS, Walmart, RiteAid) will have the same rules. WalMart, for example, will only vaccinate children in the 3-5 yr range. Check Vaccines.gov for more details.

CDC RECOMMENDS BOOSTER FOR

CHILDREN 5-11 — Following FDA Emergency Use Authorization on May 17, the CDC on May 19 recommended a booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine for children ages 5 to 11. Children in this age group who received their last dose at least five months earlier are eligible to receive the additional doses immediately.

CDC GUIDANCE ON OPTIONAL SECOND BOOSTER -- On March 30, 2022 The CDC updated their <u>Interim Clinical Considerations</u> <u>for Use of COVID-19 Vaccines</u> to allow for a 2nd booster dose in certain persons:

- Persons 12 or older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster
- All persons 50 years of age or older may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster. The second booster is recommended for those age 60+
- Persons 18-49 years of age who received the J&J COVID-19 vaccine for both their primary series and 1st booster may receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their J&J booster.

EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES

ASSISTANCE — The NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

 Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period <u>not</u> to exceed 18 months. At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship <u>during</u> the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

- Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees.
- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.
- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
