

REPORT -- The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires community water systems to deliver a Consumer Confidence Report, also known as an Annual Drinking Water Quality Report, to their customers each year. The City's 2021 reports, which were recently mailed to water customers, provide information about their drinking water quality from the previous year of sampling including a summary of detected contaminants, compliance and educational information. FIREWORKS DETAILS FOR SUN JULY 3

The City of Portsmouth and Wilcox Industries are presenting the annual fireworks display on **Sunday**, July 3, 2022 at the South Mill Pond across from the Portsmouth City Hall beginning at 9:15 pm. The rain date is Tuesday, July 5th at the same time. This celebration is an alcohol-free, familyfriendly event. NO PARKING will be permitted starting at 12 noon on Sunday, July 3rd on the streets surrounding the area in preparation for and during the fireworks display that evening. Limited handicapped parking will be available at the Public Library. The Foundry Garage will charge a flat \$3 fee on entry, and the Hanover Parking Garage will charge a flat \$6 fee on entry, for parking during the hours of 4 pm and 9 pm on Sunday, July 3rd. No dogs allowed during the event, per city ordinance, at Leary and Central Fields, South Playground and the Connie Bean Playground.



NOTE: DOG PARK ADJACENT TO LEARY FIELD WILL BE CLOSED FOR MAINTENANCE WORK, SUN JUL 3 THRU FRI JUL 8 – The park will be off-limits as of 6 am Sun Jul 3 for fireworks set-up and will remain closed thru Fri.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIPS AND PAYMENT HELP FOR SUMMER – Keep your cooling costs down by following these suggestions from Eversource:

- Use the new <u>Cooling Calculator on</u>
 <u>Eversource.com</u> to understand how much electricity their current cooling system uses.
- Keep air conditioners set at or near 78 degrees For every degree higher on the thermostat, the air conditioner will use 1-3% less electricity.
- Keep air vents clear of obstructions such as furniture, curtains and rugs.
- Operate major appliances during the cooler parts of the day when there is less demand on the electric system.
- Using curtains, shades, and blinds can lower indoor temperatures by up to 20 degrees.
- Switch to ENERGY STAR® certified LED lights which run cooler and last up to 25 times longer than incandescent lights.
- Set ceiling fans to rotate counterclockwise and at a higher speed in the summer.
- Look for the ENERGY STAR rating when purchasing new appliances including air conditioners. An oversized or undersized AC unit is less effective and uses more energy.



CDC GUIDANCE ON ASSESSING

cases in an area.

CDC AUTHORTIZES VACCINES FOR CHILDREN UNDER 5 -- Following FDA review and Emergency Use Authorization, the CDC has released supplies of the new Moderna and Pfizer vaccines for children under 5. The NH DHHS is distributing the vaccines to authorized pediatricians' offices because:

- 1. Pediatricians have the best patient history for these children and have trusted relationships with their families.
- 2. Pediatricians have extensive experience with vaccinating small children.
- 3. The administration of the COVID-19 vaccine provides the opportunity to administer other childhood vaccines.
- 4. The pediatricians' offices are an appropriate medical environment for vaccination -- and immediately addressing any issues that arise.

5. NHDHHS will be apportioning its first supplies of the under 5 vaccines -- and the detailed instructions differentiating all the vaccines -- to the pediatricians who have signed up for their distribution network.

NHDHHS said on their Jun 9 Health Care Provider call that the state would start delivering vaccines on Jun 20 to the pediatricians who had ordered by 8 Jun, and would deliver Jun 23-29 to the pediatricians who ordered after Jun 8. SOME of the commercial pharmacies that have been participating in the Federal vaccine distribution network will receive the under 5 vaccines. But not all (CVS, Walmart, RiteAid) will have the same rules. WalMart, for example, will only vaccinate children in the 3-5 yr range. Check Vaccines.gov for more details.

HOMEOWNER ASSISTANCE -- In addition to the NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program, there is a program for NH homeowners who are struggling to pay their mortgage, property taxes and other home expenses, and utilities. For more information, go to: https://homehelpnh.org/homeowners

EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES

ASSISTANCE – The NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

- Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period <u>not</u> to exceed 18 months.
- At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship <u>during</u> the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

- Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees.
- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.
- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
