

NH ELECTION NEW VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS NOV 1, ELECTION DAY TUES

NOV 8 -- New Portsmouth voters may register in advance, during regular business hours at the City Clerk's Office in City Hall (1 Junkins Avenue) through Nov 1. On that day, the City Clerk will be available to register new voters until 4:30 pm. The Board of Registrars will also offer special hours for voter registration that evening, in the City Hall Lobby, from 6 to 7:30 pm. Same-day voter registration is also accepted at the polls on Election Day, November 8.

Polling hours for the NH Election on Tues Nov 8 are from 8 am to 7 pm. Absentee ballots for the NH Election are now available. Qualified

registered voters may apply to receive an absentee ballot in person in the City Clerk's Office in City Hall or online, go to: https://tinyurl.com/bdhdkkxx
Once completed, Absentee Ballots must be received by the City Clerk's Office at City Hall by 5 pm on Mon Nov 7, the day before the election.





COVID-19 BOOSTER SITES! Find locations offering the new booster by going to the interactive map at vaccines.gov NH DHHS advises that everyone over 12 who completed the primary series vaccination 3 months ago or more should receive the new bivalent boosters. By receiving the booster (and this year's flu vaccine) you may help blunt the expected winter surge and demand on healthcare providers. The boosters are based on clinical research with the BA.1 bivalent vaccine, conducted in humans and were found to provide increased protection against severe disease and broader protection against existing and anticipated variants.

monthly, and possibly shift to more frequent meetings as needed.





HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DAY SAT NOV 12, 8 AM-12

NOON -- At the Public Works facility at 680 Peverly Hill Road. Residents of Portsmouth, Greenland and Newington are encouraged to bring household chemicals for safe disposal between 8 am and 12 noon. Proof of residency is required. Household hazardous waste collection helps safely dispose of items that can harm residents' health, the environment and drinking water supplies. CURBSIDE YARD WASTE/LEAVES PICKUP

Bagged leaves and other yard waste is collected by DPW through Nov 30 on the same day as your normal Solid Waste/trash. **PLEASE NOTE:** Use only paper or plastic biodegradable bags. If you opt to use the plastic bio-degradable bags, the bags must be factory-labeled "biodegradable." Yard waste bags, when placed curbside, shall not weigh more than 50 pounds each. **PLEASE DO NOT dispose of leaves or clippings in or near storm drains, drainage channels (where water drains rain or melting snow), wetlands or water bodies!** Check out what "Blue" has to say about yard waste: https://tinyurl.com/25rwwe8r

STATE AID CREDIT ON ELECTRIC BILLS --

The NH Legislature has approved allocating \$35 million to NH residents earning from 60% to 75% of the state's median income (\$75,000 to \$93,000 per year for a family of four). Those who are eligible and apply will get \$200 credits on their electric bills and \$450 for heating assistance. Residents with incomes below that threshold already are also eligible for other funds. You must apply through one of these Community Action Program agency to receive the assistance. ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIPS AND PAYMENT

HELP – On Aug 1, New Hampshire electric supply rates increased to more than double last August's supply rate. This significant rate increase is due to record-high natural gas prices and the global economy. Natural gas is the primary fuel for generating electricity in the region Help is available for customers who need it. Regardless of financial need, customers are eligible for various payment programs and are urged to call Eversource at 844-273-7760 or visit Eversource.com/billhelp to find the right plan for them. EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES

ASSISTANCE — The NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

- Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period <u>not</u> to exceed 18 months.
- At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship <u>during</u> the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

 Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees.

- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.
- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
