MINUTES

I. Call to Order at 5 pm

II. Approval of the Minutes of the August 6, 2025 Meeting – On a motion by Gary, seconded by Rob.

III. Discussion with Verizon representatives, Cathleen Finn, Sean Conway, Marc LeFevre

- Verizon monitors service issues in Portsmouth so was generally aware of the 'problem locations' identified by the survey results. Service challenges result from capacity and coverage limitations. The tower or "macro" solution provides 4-sector antennae that triangulate with cellphones' 8 available radio frequencies to boost an area with a 3-4 mile radius. Another tower location is advancing near the Target on Route 33. Verizon has deployed small cell technology in other areas of the City such as 100 Campus Drive and one near Walmart on Route 1. All were cited in the survey as problem reception areas.
- Verizon representatives expressed appreciation for the City's interest in pursuing collaborative solutions as there are challenges with placing towers and other infrastructure that are needed. Verizon mentioned an interest in the City's water tank on Constitution Avenue and City staff will follow up. There may be a restrictive covenant on the property that limits its use.
- Most of the service-enhancing remedies put in place recently are small cell antennae placed on utility poles that make macro service perform better for the 500-800 customers in the vicinity. Rooftops are not an option for macro installations, nor are the bridges as water is too good (i.e. produces excess 'noise') at conveying radio frequencies. Footprint needed is 10' x 20' plus access (50' x 50' of area) – and has tracked virtually every possibility in greater Portsmouth since 1998. Verizon reports an easier path to permitting now and

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has 7 locations that were planned in 2024 that were finally permitted in July 2025:

- 1500 Lafayette Rd.
 - 155 Constitution Ave (utility pole on Lafayette)
 - 801 Islington St.
 - 232 Court St. (utility pole on Pleasant)
 - 200 State St. (utility pole on Washington)
 - 155 Borthwick Ave. (utility pole on Highliner Ave)
 - 330 Borthwick Ave.
- Verizon welcomes updates on DPW/utility meetings so they are aware when wires/poles are being moved or streets torn up for possible equipment placement.
 - Verizon does provide in-home wireless service to qualified customers. Also has a direct contact fact sheet for customer service issues.
- IV. **Update on Cell Phone Service Survey to Businesses** – The initial CMS distribution to 1500 business emails has returned only 28 responses. PIO Stephanie Seacord suggested contacting the Chamber Collaborative to take advantage of one of their monthly email messages. Luis also suggested UNH Small Business center and provided a contact there.
